To graduate with a Bachelor of Science or Arts degree in Family, Community and Human Development with an emphasis in Early Childhood Education students must complete University of Utah Requirements and section (1.) Family Community and Human Development - ECE Courses. Students with this degree are well qualified to teach preschool populations (e.g., HeadStart).

Students who wish to pursue K-3 Licensure and teach in Utah must apply to the UITE and complete section (2.) K-3 Pre-licensure Courses **and** section (3.) Licensure Program Courses. Students who successfully complete sections 1,2,3 and pass the necessary examinations and related criteria will be recommended to the Utah State Board of Education for an Early Childhood Professional License. Students will be able to teach kindergarten through third grade in Utah schools.

Application timeline:

We recommend students who begin the program as first year students apply to the licensure program during their second year of course work. Students who begin the program later should meet with an academic advisor to determine the best time to apply for the licensure program. Applications due no later than February 1 of the year that the applicant plans to start the licensure program (February 1, 2024 for the 2024-2025 cohort).

Application requirements for K-3 Licensure cohort:

- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Application
- Personal Statement
- Transcripts, University of Utah and any Concurrent enrollment completed in high school.
- Three letters of recommendation: Academic, Professional, and Teaching and Working with the Youth.
- Background check (USIMS Screenshot for verification)

Teacher Candidates at the University of Utah are expected to comply with Utah State Board of Education requirements for performance assessment. Foundations of Reading Assessment

Early Childhood and Elementary Teacher Candidates at the University of Utah are expected to comply with the Utah State Board of Education's literacy preparation requirements. The USBE will require all students to pass the Foundations of Reading Assessment to be eligible for licensure recommendation. Teacher Candidates will receive an email from the USBE with testing information including registration, dates and test result information. It is encouraged that Teacher Candidates complete the Assessment in fall semester of the licensure year.
